Alvin is a long way from his original home of Kugluktuk, Nunavut. When he was young, Alvin went to live with his Granny.

"She wanted to take care of me. And she, well, she did," recalls Alvin. "I learned a lot from her. Just before she passed away, she told my mom's sister and her husband to adopt me. Which they did."

His Auntie was a social worker, his Uncle, a counsellor, together they raised Alvin as their own.

"I stayed with my auntie and my uncle after they adopted me. I call them my parents now."

Through their quidance, Alvin was given many gifts, including how to connect with his feelings.

"I used to be shy. I didn't say too much," says Alvin. "My auntie taught me to speak about my feelings."

Alvin experienced a lot of trauma throughout his life. It is proven that substance use and mental health challenges are related to trauma. Alvin's childhood trauma, the loss of his community and the death of his thirteen-year-old daughter all conspired against him.

When Alvin moved to Ottawa, he found meaningful work in the kitchen of a sports bar in the east end, putting the skills he learned at home into a profession he truly loves.

It was going well until Alvin's drinking cost him his job. From there, Alvin soon found himself sleeping rough; He spent part of one winter sleeping in a tent and eventually found his way to Shepherds of Good Hope's shelter on King Edward Avenue".

The first time Alvin visited a friend in the same Shepherds supportive housing residence where he lives now, Alvin was intrigued. There is a full kitchen, a common space to socialize, everyone has a room of their own, and the staff are caring and friendly.

"Alvin would come to the program to see his friends who lived here," says Erin Kelly, Program Manager in Shepherds supportive housing.

"He was so helpful. When a bed became available in our residence, we advocated for Alvin to move out of the emergency shelter and into our supportive housing residence. It's been good for him, and great for us. He's a great influence on all of us who live and work here."

Imagine what it would be like to spend the holidays with nowhere to go, no familiar faces, and no feeling of safety.

Imagine how it would feel to walk through the cold streets without a place to come in from the harsh winter weather.

It's a reality that too many people face, but it's a reality we are changing together.
